

Civil Service Bar's President Re-Elected Without Opposition

Saul Fishman, president of the Civil Service Bar Association, was re-elected to a second term without opposition at CSBA's nominations meeting May 14.

Mr. Fishman's slate of officers was also unopposed and elected by unanimous acclamation. They are Lester Paverman, first vice president; Sarah Fiona Phillips, second vice president; Kevin Hai, corresponding secretary; Stephanie Jean, recording secretary; Susan Hochberg, treasurer; and Welfare Fund Trustees Linda Bass and Michele Mirro.

Board Positions Contested

Nine candidates are running for seven positions on the board of directors. Candidate statements and ballots were scheduled to be mailed June 3 and will be counted by the American Arbitration Association on June 18.

In February, nearly 99 percent of the members who voted ratified a new contract. "We successfully negotiated a contract with substantial retroactive money as well as extra funds in the form of recurring increment payments and longevities, distributed at targeted experience levels and not just for the most senior people as my predecessor did," Mr. Fishman said in announcing his second term.

The union represents more than 900 attorneys who are employed by the city in dozens of agencies and authorities.
